MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATEMENT

Introduction

This Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement is a response to Section 54(1), Part 6 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and relates to actions and activities for the financial year ending 5th April 2025

Porthill Co is committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking violations in its own operations, its supply chain, and its products. We have zero-tolerance towards slavery and require our supply chain to comply with our values.

Organisational Structure

Porthill Co is a partnership and has business operations in the United Kingdom.

We operate in the glazing sector. The nature of our supply chains are sourcing materials related to the provision of glass and glazing repairs, uPVC windows and doors.

Diligence, Risk and Compliance

In order to monitor and mitigate the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking occurring within our supply chains we aim to undertake due diligence processes in relation to new suppliers being identified within a risk category. All working within Porthill Co are aware of the Modern Slavery Act including its definitions of slavery and human trafficking. Where possible we build long standing relationships with local suppliers and make clear our expectations of business behaviour. We have a culture of encouraging the reporting of concerns and the protection of whistle blowers.
